YOUTH SUPERVISION POLICY

NOTE: The ages specified are the maximum ages and are based on the child's ability to demonstrate age-appropriate behavior. Children who do not consistently demonstrate age-appropriate behavior should not be given the same degree of self-management responsibilities. Parents must use good judgment and consider the physical, emotional, and psychological maturity of their child when determining the level of supervision required.
